I am pleased to inform you that the *Gudis Family Foundation* has made a donation to Staples High School in the amount of \$5,000 in support of the 2010-11 Spectacular Staples Student Challenge, a program unique to the Westport Public Schools that is modeled after the Moody's Math Challenge. The Spectacular Staples Student Challenge differs from the Moody's Math Challenge in that it will be more interdisciplinary, rather than being focused primarily on mathematics. As such, it supports the school goal of providing students with challenging opportunities to solve real world problems and is consistent with that portion of the newly-adopted Board of Education Mission Statement that speaks to fostering critical and creative thinking and collaborative problem solving.

As of this date, it appears that we will have twelve teams participating in this event. Each team will have approximately five students. Between the contributions of *Melissa and Doug* and the *Gudis Family Foundation* the prize money now totals \$12,500 with the first place team to receive \$6000; the second place team \$4500; and, the third place team \$2000. The prize money to each team will be distributed evenly to each member of the winning teams, but it will be held in the Staples Student Activity Account until such time as it can be distributed as partial payment towards tuition to the colleges that the winning students will be attending.

I recommend acceptance of this very generous gift.

Policy P3520/Green Cleaning Programs

I have enclosed for your review a single policy for inclusion in the Board of Education Policy Manual. We have been advised by our attorneys at Shipman & Goodwin that the Board is required to adopt such a policy so that it may be in compliance with the terms and provisions of Public Act 09-81.

This policy requires the Board of Education to implement a green cleaning program in all school buildings and facilities making use of environmentally preferable cleaning products.

Presently, we are in full compliance with the law which becomes effective July 1, 2011. Through the efforts of Nancy Harris and JoAnn Duncan, our Tools for Schools Coordinator, we have implemented a comprehensive Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Program that addresses all the matters that have been incorporated into the new law.

This policy is being submitted to you only for review at this time. Board of Education approval of the policy will be requested at the meeting of March 21.

GREEN CLEANING PROGRAMS

It is the policy of the Westport Board of Education, on or before July 1, 2011, to implement a green cleaning program in which the Board procures and properly uses environmentally preferable cleaning products in school buildings and facilities.

The Westport Board of Education shall provide the staff of each school and, upon request, the parents and guardians of each child enrolled in each school with a written statement of the school district's green cleaning program. Such notice shall include (1) the types and names of environmentally preferable cleaning products being applied in schools, (2) the location of the application of such cleaning products in the school buildings and facilities, (3) the schedule of when such cleaning products are applied in the school buildings and facilities, (4) the statement, "No parent, guardian, teacher or staff member may bring into the school facility any consumer product which is intended to clean, deodorize, sanitize or disinfect" and (5) the name of the school administrator, or a designee, who may be contacted for further information. Such notice shall be provided to the parents or guardians of any child who transfers to a school during the school year and to staff hired during the school year.

The Westport Board of Education shall make such notice, as well as the report submitted to the Department of Education pursuant to subsection (a) of section 10-220 of the general statutes (i.e. required report on condition of facilities, action taken to implement the Board's long-term school building program, indoor air quality and green cleaning program), available on its web site and the web site of each school under such board's jurisdiction.
